



MATHEMATICS LESSON

TIME: DIGITAL & ANALOG

Just for fun: Do this activity after reading "The Grouchy Ladybug" by Eric Carle. The Grouchy Ladybug runs into all sorts of insects and animals at each hour of the day. Practice telling and writing time during and after you read!

Objective: Given a spoken time, draw (analog) and write (digital) the time on the clocks.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

- Clock Sheet: Printed & Laminated
 - *cut in half if you want to focus on one clock
- Dry Erase Marker & Eraser

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Begin by modeling: Say, "I am going to write 3:00", write 3:00 on the digital clock, then explain aloud as you draw a small hand pointing to the three and the long hand pointing to the 12.
2. Give the child the Clock sheet and the marker and ask them to draw varying times on the clocks.
3. Let the child tell you what to write, and have them check your work.
4. As a variation, you could draw on the analog clock and ask them to write the time on the digital clock, and vice versa.
